#3 - Forgetting to check the roofer's insurance certificate/verify license **information**

Making sure you check the roofer's insurance certification, as well as verify their license information is a mistake that many people make. Every state is run differently and it's important to understand the current law in the state you live in.

Pennsylvania's law is that if an accident occurs and the contractor doesn't have enough insurance to cover it, the homeowner is then liable to cover the incident costs. A registered contractor in Pennsylvania is only required to carry \$50,000 in insurance. These laws also apply to Worker's Compensation insurance.

It is said that a good roofing company carries at least \$1 million in property and personal injury insurance.

You can go to http://www.licensepa.state.pa.us/ to verify license information on businesses and individuals regulated by the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs in the state of Pennsylvania. This website also has information regarding whether or not there have been any lawsuits against the contractor.

Don't second guess asking the company you are hiring to show you their insurance certification. It's important to understand what you are looking for when viewing these documents. Make sure the contractor has enough insurance to cover any injuries that could occur and make sure their license is active.

#4 - How do they guarantee their work?

It's important to understand there is a difference betwe—en the manufacturer's warranty—and the guarantee the roofer gives on the work he's providing to yo—u. The manufacturer will have warrantees that cover the materials used that will include replacement costs on the product; not the mistakes made during installation or even against future leaks.

Many roofers do not guarantee their work against leaks. This is mainly because it's almost impossible to put a time frame on how long the roof will last without a leak.

#5 - An impressive warranty

Warranties are a very important part of the purchasing process. Everything from vacuums, televisions and of course motor vehicles has warranties that come with them, or that can be purchased along with the item.

Some consumers look for words such as, lifetime or forever. But what do these words really mean?

It's crucial to understand what the war ranty is actually saying. For example, a lifetime warranty guarantees the lifetime of the product on the market, not the lifetime of the customer. When a product is discontinued the "lifetime" warranty is then limited to a certain period of time.

It's also important to research information regarding the warranty. Words like "extended" and "breech" can be confusing to some consumers. You really want to know what the warranty is covering, the length of the warranty and how the company will replace or repair the purchased materials.

#6 Doing the job yourself

With any home improvement job it's crucial to understand what you'll actually be doing. You're taking a huge risk when doing a roofing project on your own. You don't have roofing insurance and none of the work you do will be covered under a warranty.

It's extremely important to have a professional roofing contractor do the work on your home.

Not only is insurance, and having a warranty a concern, but safety issues are also necessary to think about. No one is prepared for a un- needed injury to themselves.

It's also important to ask yourself, do you know what areas of the roof are vulnerable and do you know how to properly ventilate the new roof? These are both important parts of the roofing process and cannot be neglected.
